ROSE HILL & IFFLEY LOW CARBON: **ROSE HILL SOLAR SAVER TRIAL LAUNCHES** **IN NEW-BUILD FLATS**

Great news! The residents of the new-build flats in Ashhurst Way and Desborough Crescent are invited to take part in an energy trial that will save them money on their energy bills.

You've probably noticed that the new flats have solar panels installed on the roof. These generate clean electricity when the sun is shining.

The Project LEO trial is learning how people living in the flats can benefit from the solar on the roof, without paying to install the solar panels themselves. We hope to learn if and how residents of similar flats could benefit from cheaper, low carbon electricity from shared solar panels.

The project is also testing how solar panels and very large batteries can work together. The batteries could free up space on the national grid at times of peak demand, such as when we all cook our dinner.

Rose Hill Primary School has both rooftop solar PV and a newly installed large battery. We are testing whether the school can make better use of the green electricity produced by the solar PV panels on its roof by storing it and releasing it at different times of the day when it's needed. If this works, then it may be a solution for other schools or similar energy users with solar PV on their roofs.

FRIENDS OF RIVERMEAD NATURE PARK: **RIVERMEAD NATURE PARK WOODLAND** **UPDATE**

Work to improve the woodland between Court Place Gardens and the river (next to the Nature Park) will take place in September and October.



Oxford University, which owns the site, has agreed a management plan with the Forestry Commission.

This aims to increase the variety of living things in the wood, for example by creating small clearings where sunlight-loving species can thrive.

Workers will also remove any trees that could endanger passers-by, but will reuse the wood onsite so far as is possible.

The University also plans to create a permissive path through the woodland that will allow local people to walk there. For your safety, please heed warning signs around the site during the works.
