We'd like to extend a warm welcome to the latest members of our
community who recently moved into their new homes on Ashurst Way and
The Oval.

The 43 flat development was completed by the council's housing company,
Oxford City Housing Ltd (OCHL). They include 18 council homes on the site of
the old scout hut and advice centre and 25 shared ownership homes where
the 1950s community centre once stood.

As part of Project LEO, OCHL is working in partnership with the Low Carbon
Hub to trial a new energy offer using electricity generated by solar panels
on the flats. The trial will start this summer.

The Council has made a series of short films featuring our ward Councillor's,
Shaista Aziz and Ed Turner, talking about the importance of building new
